


Nepal Bhutan Popular Tour 2024/2025

Your Journey day by day

Day 01: Fly from Bangkok/Kathmandu/New Delhi to Paro, Bhutan and drive to Thimphu.

After arriving at Paro Airport, our representative/guide will receive you there. You will drive to Thimphu from Paro. Along the way, the guide will provide you with the necessary information about the trip ad more.

On

the way to the Paro-Thimphu highway, visit the 16th-century old Tachogang Lhakhang temple. The temple means the hill of the excellent horse. You need to cross an old bridge to visit the temple. From the bridge, enjoy the scenic views of the villages.



Rest for a while after reaching your hotel in Thimphu. Head out for a self-exploratory walk in the local markets in the evening. These are lively and get to the first close glance at the Bhutanese lifestyle. Overnight at Thimphu.

Day 02: Drive to Punakha/Wangdi via Dochu-La Pass and Punakha Tour.

We will visit two UNESCO heritage sites today starting from the Hindu temple of Pashupatinath. Learn more about the Hindu rites and rituals with a brief tour of this beautiful temple complex beside the Bagmati River. Next, we will take a short drive to the Majestic Boudhanath stupa. The biggest Stupa of Nepal, Boudhanath showcases a glimpse of Tibetan culture and Buddhism at the heart of Kathmandu Valley. Return to the hotel and rest for the day. Overnight at Kathmandu.

Day 06: Bhaktapur sightseeing, Swoyambhunath (Monkey Temple) and Basantapur

Our heritage tour continues today as we will visit three more UNESCO heritage sites. Following Breakfast, we will have a drive of an hour to reach the iconic Bhaktapur city. Entering the Medieval era like streets and settlements we will get to know the Newari culture from close here. Bhaktapur Durbar Square is our first destination alongside many. This iconic palace square hosts the art, monuments, and pieces of History itself at Kathmandu Valley. The Pottery Square and Nyatapola temple complex are two other destinations in Bhaktapur that we will explore. We will also try the local Newari cuisine highlighted by the famous King Curd 'JuJu Dhau' of Bhaktapur.

Next, we will drive back to Kathmandu and visit the well-known Swayambhunath, or 'the monkey temple'. On a high hill overlooking the Kathmandu valley, Swayambhunath Temple is a spiritual center for both Hindu and Buddhist devotees. Towards the evening we will visit the Kathmandu/Basantapur Durbar Square which is near your hotel. The Kumari Temple, Taleju Temple, and other fantastic monuments await you at the square. In the evening explore around Ason and Thamel markets to get a slice of local commerce. Overnight at Kathmandu.

Day 07: Drive/flight to Chitwan National park

You have options to fly or drive to Chitwan from Kathmandu Valley. The drive winds down a hill highway beside Trishuli River and is about 6 hours long. We will stop in one of the midway towns for lunch. You can also try some local snacks and fruits in the brief stops throughout the drive. The short flight (30 mins) takes you to Bharatpur Airport in Chitwan.

The Tal Barahi and Bindabasini Temples are the religious centers you can visit early today. The caves of Pokhara namely Gupteshor, Mahendra, and Bat caves are next for your visit. You can also visit the International Mountaineering Museum before completing the Pokhara travel.

We will return to Kathmandu by a flight or drive in the afternoon from Pokhara. Overnight at Kathmandu.

Day 11: Flight back to Bangkok/New Delhi or next destination.

Spend some time for a Souvenir shopping session in the vibrant markets of Thamel in your spare time.



The Handicrafts, organic products, and ornaments are few to choose from this Himalayan nation.

We will drive you to the airport a few hours before your departure. With some beautiful memories and stories to treasure, you will complete the Bhutan Nepal Tour with Asia Experiences.

What are some highlights of the Nepal Bhutan Popular Tour?

The tour includes visiting UNESCO World Heritage sites in Kathmandu, exploring the cultural and historical landmarks of Bhaktapur and Patan, experiencing the natural beauty of Pokhara, and discovering the enchanting city of Paro and the iconic Tiger's Nest Monastery in Bhutan.

What is included in the Nepal Bhutan Popular Tour package?

The package usually includes accommodation in comfortable hotels, transportation between destinations, guided tours, entrance fees to attractions, meals as specified in the itinerary, and visa assistance for Bhutan.



Which country to choose?

While it is necessary to have a pre-booked tour in Bhutan, the process is fairly simple. After you've purchased the vacation and decided where you want to go in Bhutan, the tour operator takes care of practically everything else, including visa applications. We will submit the paperwork on your behalf and obtain all of the permissions you will need for your trip after receiving a scan of your passport. You will receive a visa acceptance letter so that you can book your travel to Bhutan, and your visa and permits will be given once you reach Paro International Airport. Your travel guide and driver, who are required, will greet you at the airport and transport you in a private vehicle to the locations listed on your itinerary.

Independent traveling in Nepal and Bhutan

With the exception of trekking paths, which require permits but not a guide if you wouldn't want one, independent travel is permitted in Nepal, and there are no limits on where you can go in the country. Traveling in Nepal is simple, so you are free to go wherever you want.

Bhutan, on the other hand, has more stringent regulations as a result of the country's environmental tourism policy. All visitors to Bhutan must be on a pre-arranged trip with motor transportation, driver, and ranger, and even when trekking, you will always be accompanied by a guide and supporting crew. This is done to safeguard the kingdom's ecosystem from the devastation that tourism typically causes, as well as to preserve the kingdom's unique experience for others.

Traveling between Nepal and Bhutan

The Tribhuvan International Airport in Kathmandu, Nepal's capital, is one of nine airports in five nations that fly to Bhutan on a regular basis. This makes it quite simple to travel to Bhutan from Nepal. In the peak season, flights leave Nepal every day, with extra flights added when demand is high, and the flight might not be that expensive at USD 230 per person. The flight takes approximately 1 hour 15 minutes and arrives in Paro early in the mornings.

Major site-seeing areas in Nepal and Bhutan

There are plenty of things to see and do in Nepal, but the Kathmandu Valley has to be at the top of the list. The largest stupa in Nepal, Boudhanath Stupa, is located in the Kathmandu Valley and was built in the 14th century near the trade route from Tibet. The Swayambhunath Temple, also known as the Monkey Temple, is one of Kathmandu's most beautiful monuments, with an enormous stupa with intriguing Buddha eyes and a golden pinnacle.

The Tiger's Nest Monastery is the best spot to visit in Bhutan, as it is the heartland of Buddhism. This magnificent Goemba, also known as the Taktsang Monastery, is located halfway up the mountain that overlooks the Paro Valley and was where Padmasambhava arrived in Bhutan on the back of a gigantic tiger. The dazzling white walls of Punakha Dzong are contrasted by the lavender Jacaranda trees that



encircle the temple, making it one of Bhutan's most attractive monasteries.

Outdoor activities in Nepal and Bhutan

Both Nepal and Bhutan seem to be good for their hiking paths, and there is no better place to visit for people interested in elevated trekking. You may also explore the famed takin, the local equivalent of the moose, and the national symbol of Bhutan, which is a rare animal located only in this one country on the globe.

Nepal, on the other hand, is one of the most popular outdoor pursuits locations in the world. There is more than enough to keep even the most seasoned adventure seeker pleased for years, from white-water rafting and bungee jumping to kayaking several rivers and ice-climbing in the highlands.

Best time to visit Nepal and Bhutan

Both Nepal and Bhutan have comparable climates, with significant rainy and dry periods that coincide. The greatest times to visit these two Himalayan countries are in the spring and fall, from March to May and September to November, though you can go at any time of year based on what you're doing and where you would like to go.

In Nepal and Bhutan's Himalayan regions, winter is a season when it gets chilly and snowier. While elevated treks are frequently available at this time, there are many sites to explore and hike in the lower regions of the countries, where the wintertime is mild and the climate is still pleasant. The rainy season occurs throughout the summer months, and this is when the majority of the rain falls over the globe. However, even in the midst of the monsoon, there are locations both in Nepal and Bhutan where there is little to no rain and it is still possible to trek or explore.

Meals in Nepal and Bhutan

The cuisine of the Himalayas is quite distinct, and Nepalese cuisine, although inspired both by India and China, has a distinct native flavor. The national food is Dal-Bhat, which consists of a legume soup served with rice and a variety of side dishes like pickles, curries, meats, curd, and fish. You may also taste the famed mo: mo, which are steamed dumplings that are mainly packed with veggies but also come in meat versions.

Bhutanese cuisine is distinct, and native foods are known for being hot. Many cuisines include chilies, and cheese is another popular component. Ema Datshi is a traditional stew filled with chilies and cheese that is typically too spicy for most people. Jasha Maroo, the local version of spicy chicken, is more similar to an Indian dish, with more spice than you'd expect just by looking at it. Bhutan is also known for its red rice, which is the primary ingredient in all Bhutanese dishes.

Hotels in Nepal and Bhutan



You can stay in a variety of places in Nepal, ranging from the cheapest guest houses for as little as 2 dollars per night to four-star- star hotels for as much as 150 dollars per night. This ensures you'll always be able to find somewhere to live that fits your wallet.

Bhutan, on the other hand, is a very different story. As part of the comprehensive package, tourists must stay in hotels with a minimum rating of three stars. In Bhutan, there are also four and five-star hotels, which you can stay in for an additional fee.

Nepal Bhutan Tour cost
