Your Journey day by day

Day 01: Arrive in Kathmandu and apply for a Tibet Visa

Land at the Tribhuvan International Airport in Kathmandu and apply for a Nepal Visa after completing all the customs. The visa process only takes 15-20 minutes to complete. Our representative welcomes you at the airport and transfers to the hotel for a short rest. Then, head to the Chinese Visa Centre in Kathmandu to apply for a Tibet Visa where you must submit your original passport, passport-size photos, and biometrics. It takes 4 working days to get a Tibet Visa. The evening is free to explore on your own. Return to the hotel for an overnight stay.

(**Note:** You don't require a Chinese Visa to apply for a Tibet Visa from Nepal.)



Day 02: Kathmandu Sightseeing

Kathmandu, the capital of Nepal is popular as 'the city of temples'. The city is treasured with numerous UNESCO-listed World Heritage Sites. Commence Kathmandu sightseeing after breakfast with a visit to the popular Swayambhunath Stupa also well-known as 'Monkey Temple'.

Next, head to the architecturally aesthetic Patan Durbar Square. Get mesmerized by the artistic marvels of the Patan Durbar Square and visit iconic landmarks such as Krishna Mandir, Mahaboudha Temple, Golden Temple, Rato Machhindrantah Temple, Chwoks (Mul, Sundari, Keshav Narayan), Patan Museum, etc. Savor delicious authentic Newari cuisine and visit souvenir shops as well.

Then, proceed to the beautiful Boudhanath Stupa which has great historical and cultural significance. End your sightseeing with a visit to the sacred Pashupatinath Temple which is dedicated to Lord Shiva. Relish the scene of the evening 'Aarti' which is captivating as a new experience to witness for the visitors. Back to the hotel for an overnight stay.

- Swayambhunath Stupa: Holy Buddhist pilgrimage site also popular as 'Monkey Temple' and the best place to get the view of Kathmandu Valley
- Patan Durbar Square: Marvelous ancient temples, monuments, and courtyards and aesthetically captivating architecture
- **Boudhanath Stupa:** A prominent Buddhist pilgrimage site and also one of the biggest Buddhist Stupas in Nepal
- Pashupatinath Temple: A holy Hindu temple with historic, cultural, and religious significance

Day 03: Bhaktapur Durbar Square, Changu Narayan, Nagarkot Sightseeing

In the morning, visit the well-preserved beautiful medieval city of Bhaktapur Durbar Square. Sightsee iconic historical and cultural wonders that are architecturally impressive. Explore Victorian-style temples, artistic courtyards, **Nyatpole Temple, Dattatreya Temple, the 55-window palace, the Pottery Square,** etc. in the surrounding area. Savor some local Newari cuisine the famous Juju Dhau (King Curd).

Next, visit one of the oldest Hindu temples of Nepal **Changu Narayan Temple** at a hilltop near Bhaktapur. Relish the remarkable architecture where you witness the intricate wood and stone carvings. It is a testament to the skillful craftsmanship of the Licchavi period.

From here, enjoy a scenic ride to the beautiful hill station Nagarkot at an elevation of 2,175 meters. It is renowned for its sunrise views over the Himalayan ranges. Cherish the lush greenery, beautiful mountain views, peaceful environment far from the bustling city, terraced fields, and ideal climate and weather, especially during the Spring and Autumn seasons. In the evening, head to the Nagarkot View Tower station to witness the amazing sunset views over the Himalayan ranges. Enjoy the finest cuisine in the hotel and adore the picturesque scenery. Stay overnight in a hotel.

(**Optional Hiking:** From Changu Narayan to Telkot for 2-3 hours for interested visitors.)

• **Bhaktapur Durbar Square:** A well-preserved medieval city in Nepal with impressive architecture and several marvelous attractions



- Changu Narayan: One of the oldest Hindu temples in Nepal that hold great historical and cultural significance
- Nagarkot: A beautiful hill station to witness lush greenery, and phenomenal sunrise and sunset views over the Himalayan ranges including the world's highest Mt. Everest

Day 04: Nagarkot to Kathmandu, Fly to Pokhara & Sightseeing

Wake up early and head to the Nagarkot View Tower Station to relish the sunrise views over the 8 Himalayan ranges from Mahalangur to Annapurna ranges. Back to the hotel for breakfast.

Then, head to the airport in Kathmandu to fly to the tourist capital Pokhara. Take a domestic flight that takes approx. 25 minutes and transfer to a hotel. After freshening up, explore some popular attractions like Davis Falls or Devi's Falls and Gupteshwor Mahadev Cave. Visit the lakeside area and nearby market areas. Spend the evening at a restaurant relishing the fine dinner with cultural singing and dance performances or exploring Pokhara nightlife. Stay overnight in a hotel.

- Davis Falls (Devi's Falls): The most traveled beautiful waterfall attraction in Pokhara
- Gupteshwor Mahadev Cave: An attractive cave with the sight of the bottom of Davis Falls

Day 05: Pokhara tour with Sarangkot sunrise, back to Kathmandu

Take a short scenic ride in the early morning to the popular viewpoint of Sarangkot to enjoy the sunrise view. Get mesmerized by an amazing sunrise view over the snowy Himalayas such as **Dhaulagiri**, **Machhapuchhre**, and **Annapurna ranges**. Back to the hotel for breakfast.

After breakfast, visit **Seti Gorge, and the International Mountain Museum** which are beautiful attractions. Next, go for an exciting **Phewa Lake** boat ride cherishing the surrounding mountain vistas including Machhapuchhre. Visit the **Tal Barahi temple** that lies in the middle of the lake.

Then, fly back to Kathmandu, collect the Tibet Group Visa, and get transferred to the hotel. Make sure to pack all the essentials and check them properly before flying to Tibet the other day. Spend a night in a hotel.

- Sarangkot: Nearest and most popular sunrise viewpoint to enjoy sunrise view over the majestic Himalayas
- Seti Gorge: One of the most beautiful gorges in Pokhara
- International Mountain Museum: A must-visit place to learn about the culture and lifestyle of mountain people
- Phewa Lake Boat Ride: A scenic Phewa Lake boat ride offers the views of beautiful surrounding mountains

Note: (There is an option of sightseeing around Peace Stupa, Pumdikot Shiva Statue, or Annapurna Cable Car ride for interested travelers.)

Day 06: Flight to Lhasa (Tibet)



Fly to Lhasa from Kathmandu and admire the Himalayan scenery and picturesque vistas. Land at Lhasa Gonggar Airport and get welcomed by a professional English-speaking guide. Transfer to the hotel in Lhasa enjoying a scenic 1.5-2 hours private vehicle ride. Acclimatize properly and adjust to the surrounding environment as Lhasa is at an elevation of 3656 m. Make sure to take proper rest, eat warm and healthy food, drink plenty of water, and wear warm comfortable clothes. Spend a night in a hotel.

Day 07: Lhasa Sightseeing

Lhasa sightseeing commences after breakfast where we explore iconic landmarks listed in **UNESCO World Heritage Sites.** These landmarks are the symbol of the great Tibetan culture. Visit the most popular and grand **Potala Palace** and in its vicinity famous **Jokhang Temple** and stroll around ancient **Barkhor Street.** The religious significance is very high so wear appropriate clothes while exploring Lhasa. Spend a night in a hotel.

- **Potala Palace:** A significant palace that is now a museum renowned for its impressive architecture, and 13 storeys of buildings with (1,000 rooms, 10,000 shrines, and approx. 200,000 statues)
- **Jokhang Temple:** Sacred spiritual Buddhist temple with incredible architecture influenced by Tibetan, Nepalese, Tang, and Indian Dynasty
- **Barkhor Street:** Popular sacred street for performing the kora ritual around the holy Jokhang temple, learning Tibetan culture, buying Tibetan original goods and crafts

Note: (Interested travelers can attend the grand **Princess Wencheng Live Drama** after dinner. Through drama, music, and dances it displays the historical and cultural ties between the Tubo and Tang dynasties.)

Day 08: Lhasa Sightseeing

Continue Lhasa sightseeing with a visit to the phenomenal **Norbulingka Palace** which means **Jewel Park** in Tibetan. It is listed as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site** which organizes the popular Shoton festival (Yogurt festival) annually. Then, head to visit two popular monasteries of the Gelug School of Tibetan Buddhism which are **Drepung Monastery** and **Sera Monastery**. Experience the deep-rooted Tibetan Buddhism and learn about it while exploring the monasteries. Don't miss debate sessions between 3-5 pm at the Sera Monastery. Stay overnight in a hotel.

- Norbulingka Palace: Impressive Tibetan architecture palace that annually organizes the popular Shoton festival
- **Drepung Monastery:** One of the largest sacred monasteries in Tibet with striking architecture and learning center of Tibetan Buddhism and practice meditation
- **Sera Monastery:** Impressive monastery with beautiful architecture, assembly hall, decorative statues, murals, & scriptures and unique debate sessions

Note: (Interested travelers can attend the **Tibetan Family Kitchen class** between 4:30 pm to 8 pm where they can cook, and dine with family and friends.)

Day 09: Flight to Phnom Penh (Cambodia) via Beijing



Fly to Phnom Penh, the capital of Cambodia via Beijing. Get welcomed by our representative at the airport and transfer to the hotel for some rest. Phnom Penh is the largest city in Cambodia where you can witness the remnants of its French colonial history. It houses architecturally impressive landmarks showcasing Cambodia's rich history and culture. Some of the iconic landmarks are Wat Langka, Wat Moha Montrey, Wat Phnom, Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum, The Royal Palace, the Independence Monument, the National Museum of Cambodia, etc. Later explore some iconic landmarks and in the evening stroll around the night market and street food tour. Spend a night in a hotel.

- Wat Langka: A colorful Buddhist temple that houses Buddha statues and a vast collection of Buddhist holy writings
- Wat Moha Montrey: A temple with splendid architecture and designs renowned for its huge space
- Wat Phnom: The largest Buddhist temple in the city offering phenomenal surrounding vistas
- **Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum:** A museum that was formerly a secret prison that exhibits the dark phase of Cambodia's history through photographs, artifacts, and evidence

Day 10: Phnom Penh Sightseeing and Fly to Siem Reap

Continue to Phnom Penh sightseeing after breakfast. Tuk-Tuk tours are extremely popular in Phnom Penh and if you wish to, commence sightseeing riding on Tuk-Tuk. Visit the iconic landmarks 'The Royal Palace', the Independence Monument, and the largest central museum in Cambodia, the National Museum of Cambodia.

In the afternoon, fly to Siem Reap which is the second largest city in Cambodia. It is renowned for its largest religious complexes including the famous Angkor Region. The ancient structures hold great historical, cultural, and religious importance. Transfer to the hotel for a short rest and commence Siem Reap sightseeing. Visit UNESCO World Heritage Sites which are a part of Angkor Archaeological Park such as Bayon Temple, Baphuon Temple, and Pre Rup Temple.

Relish the nightlife, explore the night market, and enjoy dinner at a fine restaurant. Stay overnight in a hotel.

- The Royal Palace: Iconic landmark displaying traditional Khmer architecture and amazing attractions (Silver Pagoda, Throne Hall, Pavilions, Khemarin Palace, etc.)
- **Independence Monument:** A national pride of Cambodia that honors the country's independence from France
- National Museum of Cambodia: The largest central museum in Cambodia which is a great educational hub that has a stunning collection from different periods of Cambodia's history
- **Bayon Temple:** The only Buddhist shrine in the Angkor region famous for its large huge smiling stone blocks signifying Bodhisattva Avalokiteshvara
- **Baphuon Temple:** An ancient temple built on an artificial hill converted into a Theravada Buddhist temple is also called a 'golden mountain'
- **Pre Rup Temple:** A Hindu temple built with bricks, laterite, and sandstones is perfect for a sunset view

Day 11: Angkor Archaeological Park Sightseeing

The second day of Siam Reap is a full day of Angkor Archaeological Park sightseeing which is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The Angkor region is culturally and naturally diverse. Angkor Archaeological Park is abundant with ancient temples, monuments, and archaeological sites that showcase Cambodia's rich ancient history. Some of the popular attractions are Angkor Wat, Bakong Temple, Bayon Temple, Baphuon Temple, Ta Prohm Temple, Banteay Srei Temple, Angkor Thom, Preah Khan, Angkor National Museum, etc. It is a must-explored landmark that has huge Hindu and Buddhist influences.

End the day with a phenomenal Sunset Cruise on Tonle Sap. The cruise duration is 1.5 hours and you get rewarded with beautiful scenes of the Four Face Rivers Mekong River and explore Diamond Island and a Fishing Village. Witness stilted houses, interact with the locals, and learn about their lifestyle. Relish the magical sunset view and back to Siem Reap. After completing the sightseeing, the evening is free to explore on your own. Go for shopping or street food tours. Relish the nightlife at Pub Street. Spend a night in a hotel.

- **Angkor Wat:** The world's largest Hindu-Buddhist temple structure that has impressive architecture and is famous for its sunrise view
- Bakong Temple: The first mountain temple of the Khmer period that has a step pyramid structure
- Banteay Srei Temple: An astonishing 10th-century Lord Shiva-Parvati dedicated Hindu temple that is largely built of red sandstones
- **Ta Prohm Temple:** Founded as Mahayana Buddhist Monastery that was built without mortar is popular as 'Tomb Raider Temple' or 'Angelina Jolie Temple'
- **Angkor Thom:** Built in Bayon style famous for its temples and iconic landmarks such as Mangalartha, Terrace of Elephants, Terrace of the Leper King, Phimeanakas, etc.
- **Preah Khan:** One of the last remaining remote structures that has stunning carvings is a learning center for Buddhist monks
- **Angkor National Museum:** A great historical, cultural, and educational hub that houses artifacts of the Khmer Empire, and several idols of Hindu and Buddhist gods
- Sunset Cruise on Tonle Sap: A scenic tour on a cruise to enjoy the sunset view, explore the fishing village, and learn about their local lifestyle

Note: (Visitors seeking new experiences can attend the famous Cambodian Phare Circus where the historical, folk, and modern Cambodian stories are present uniquely.

Show time: 8:00 pm which lasts for an hour and pre-show entertainment starts at 5:30 pm.)

Day 12: Siem Reap Sightseeing

Continue to Siem Reap sightseeing with a visit to the Cambodian Cultural Village also popular as Angkor Green Park. This village tour is a great way to learn deeply the Cambodian history and culture as it features 12 villages with distinct Cambodian cultures. Visit the Wax Museum and traditional Khmer houses, explore local markets, and try Khmer cuisine. Get fascinated by traditional dance performances. Interact with locals and learn more in-depth. Back to Siam Reap after completing a meaningful village tour.



Continue the Angkor Archaeological Park sightseeing and complete visiting the beautiful landmarks. If you wish to you can go on an adventurous Quad Bike Ride tour which runs between 7 am to 4 pm. The ride duration is 1.5 hours where you pass through small villages and rice fields and admire surrounding green fields. There are also sunrise tour, half-day, and full-day ride tour options which visitors can choose as their preferences. Professional guides accompany you and provide you with full safety instructions before a ride.

After completing sightseeing if you wish to go shopping explore Central Market, Aeon Mall, etc. Relish nightlife and go for street food tours. Spend a night in a hotel.

- Cambodian Cultural Village (Angkor Green Park): It features 12 villages each displaying a diverse characteristic of Cambodian culture, heritage, and lifestyle
- Quad Bike Ride Tour (optional): An adventurous ATV bike ride traversing through small villages and rice fields

Note: (Visitors seeking new experiences can attend the famous Apsara Dance Show which displays well-preserved Cambodian culture and heritage through Khmer Traditional Dances.)(Show time: Mostly after 8:00 pm and Dinner time: After 7:00 pm.)

Day 13: Flight to Luang Prabang and Sightseeing, Laos

Fly to Luang Prabang which is a UNESCO-listed town that is the ideal combination of rural and urban architecture. It is a remarkable destination where art, culture, architecture, and heritages including French colonial are well-preserved. Transfer to the hotel and later sightsee some iconic landmarks such as Phra Bang, Royal Palace Museum, Wat Wisunarat, Wat Xieng Thong, and UNESCO-listed Old Quarter Streets. In the evening, enjoy the surrounding mountains, scenery, and sunset have dinner in the historic town of Old Quarter.

- Phra Bang: The Royal Buddha Image symbolizes the city's cultural and religious heritage
- **Royal Palace Museum:** One of the finest architecture museums with traditional Lao motifs and French Beaux-Arts styles
- Wat Wisunarat: Oldest temple in Luang Prabang with impressive stupas
- Wat Xieng Thong: It means 'Temple of the Golden City' which is a remarkable testament to Lao Architecture
- Old Quarter Streets: Visit the UNESCO Heritage Site and admire the Buddhist and French Colonial architecture, surrounding mountain views, and greenery

Day 14: Luang Prabang Sightseeing with Pak Ou Cave

Commence Luang Prabang sightseeing early in the morning with a scenic hike to Mount Phousi at Phou Si Hill. From the hill, cherish the incredible sunrise views, breathtaking city sights, the beautiful Mekong River, and the Nam Khan. Also, visit Wat Chom Si Buddhist temple and a cave nearby. Descend slowly and enjoy breakfast.

(**Note:** You can hike to Mount Phousi after breakfast if you wish to.)



Next, head to a boat cruise down the Mekong River and visit the magnificent Pak Ou Caves. These historically significant caves house thousands of Buddha miniatures set on a limestone cliff. Visit 2 caves Tham Ting and Tham Theung where you witness various sizes and postures of Buddha statues. Return to the hotel and halfway, stop at the beautiful village of Ban Xieng Hai.

This village is popular as 'The Whiskey Village' where locals make homemade whiskies fondly called 'Lao Lao'. Try a little if you wish to, it is prepared of rice which is distilled in an earthen jar. Interact with the locals, learn the local culture, and adore the fine handicrafts (traditional bamboo products, pottery, woven textiles, etc.). Back to Luang Prabang on a vehicle admiring the surroundings and transferred to the hotel.

(**Note:** You can stay at the bank of the Mekong River to relish the sunset view.)

In the evening, visit the lively Luang Prabang Night Market. The night markets are popular for souvenir goods, textiles, paintings, and handicrafts. After exploring the market, go to a restaurant for dinner or try street food.

- **Mount Phousi:** A beautiful hill to enjoy the sunrise view and breathtaking city views and surroundings
- Pak Ou Caves: A notable pilgrimage site that is culturally significant and houses thousands of miniature Buddha sculptors
- Ban Xieng Hai: Also known as 'The Whiskey Village' popular for its local homemade rice whiskies and skillful handicraft goods of the locals
- Luang Prabang Night Market: Vibrant market for souvenir goods (artwork, handicrafts, textiles, etc.) and local street foods

Day 15: Luang Prabang tour with Kuang Si waterfall

Today Luang Prabang sightseeing commences with an early morning visit to a Phosi Morning Market. It is the biggest market where you can see a variety of goods such as tropical fruits, traditional handicrafts, souvenirs, spices, dried buffalo skin, etc. Then, head on a scenic ride to the popular Kuang Si Waterfall.

Take a short walk towards the waterfall relishing the lush greenery and arrive at the waterfall with 3 tiers which are turquoise blue in color and look mesmerizing. Capture some beautiful memories, explore the surroundings fully, and you can swim in the waterfall if you wish. (Note: Wear an appropriate swimsuit and bring an extra pair of clothes.)

Visit Tat Kuang Si Bear Sanctuary near the vicinity and observe rescued and rehabilitated Asiatic Moon Bears in a natural habitat. After this amazing tour, continue to drive to Luang Prabang.

On halfway, stop at Luang Prabang Elephant Camp where you spend close time with elephants. Learn about elephants, how to care for them, feed them, and bathe them which is a heartwarming experience. After spending time here, drive to nearby Buffalo Farm.

The Laos Buffalo Farm is a fantastic learning center to learn about the production of buffalo cheese dairy products. This place is also popular for unique ice creams made up of buffalo milk. Try it if you like and



return to Luang Prabang.

If time permits, visit the Hmong village of Ban Ou, and witness ethnic tribes or visit the Khmu village of Ban Thapene popular for traditional basket weaving. Learn the basket weaving process and interact with the locals. Back to Luang Prabang and in the evening, relish the nightlife and street food tours.

- **Phosi Morning Market:** A happening market where all kinds of goods are found like spices, souvenirs, handicrafts, traditional clothing, etc., and also experience local culture and cuisine
- Kuang Si Falls: The 3-tiered waterfall with turquoise color looks mesmerizing
- Tat Kuang Si Bear Sanctuary: Observe rescued Asian Moon Bears playing and having fun in a natural habitat
- Luang Prabang Elephant Camp: Learn closely about elephants' nature, and learn to feed, bathe, and care for them
- Laos Buffalo Farm: Learn about the production of buffalo cheese dairy products, and try unique ice cream made up of buffalo milk
- Ethnic Villages: Visit the Hmong village of Ban Ou (to witness ethnic tribes) or the Khmu village of Ban Thapene (popular for traditional basket weaving)

Day 15: Flight to Vientiane, Laos, and Vientiane Sightseeing

Take a flight to the capital of Laos, Vientiane, also the largest city that is situated on the banks of the Mekong River. Transfer to the hotel for a short refreshment. This city is home to various popular landmarks which are historically and culturally significant and are the symbol of the nation. Commence Vientiane sightseeing with a visit to Pha That Luang-national symbol of Laos. Visit significant monuments such as Patuxai, Wat Si Saket, and That Dam, and museums displaying Laotian arts and history.

- Pha That Luang: A Buddhist stupa with a large gold-covered is a Laos national symbolism
- Patuxai: A Victory Gate in the center of Vientiane is a noteworthy war memorial
- Wat Si Saket: It features thousands of silver Buddha images
